



2008 Eagle Bay Klondike General Information

First Aid: Will be available at Miakonda Lodge. However, each Troop should be able to handle minor injuries. All injuries requiring medical attention should report to the Camp Staff at Miakonda Lodge. Please bring Permission Slips when you come.

Permission Slips: Every Scout should have a permission slip signed by their parents/guardian giving permission for any medical treatments, hospital visits, etc. These forms should be kept in the campsite and be available in the event of an emergency.

Uniforms: Scouts should be in Class A uniforms upon arrival at camp, at worship services, flag ceremonies and during the campfire. During the day on Saturday, Scouts should dress for extended exposure to cold weather. This should include waterproof boots.

Fees: The cost for the Klondike will be \$5 per person. This does not include meals or cabin rental. All Webelos parents will be charged the event fee.

Awards: The events at Klondike are of a competitive nature and were developed primarily for "Boy Scout" age youth. Some of the stations will have a separate set of rules for Webelos participation

Klondike Policies: The following rules were developed to ensure a fun and safe weekend. It is the responsibility of the Scout Leaders to see that their scouts know and understand the rules. Violation of these rules may result in individuals being asked to leave camp.

- ✦ Vehicles – no personal vehicles beyond the parking area
- ✦ Fires – allowed in designated areas only. None outside of the fire rings. (No fires should be left unattended)
- ✦ Knives – no sheath knives allowed (Scout pocket knives recommended)
- ✦ Lights Out – All lights out and quiet after 11:00 PM. Scouts in the cabins.
- ✦ Scout Spirit; The Scout Oath and Law are our guides for this camping experience.

Lunch: Troops will be on their own for lunch. Fires will be available at several designated locations for those that want to cook on the trail.

Skits: All troops are expected to come to camp with a skit for the campfire.
